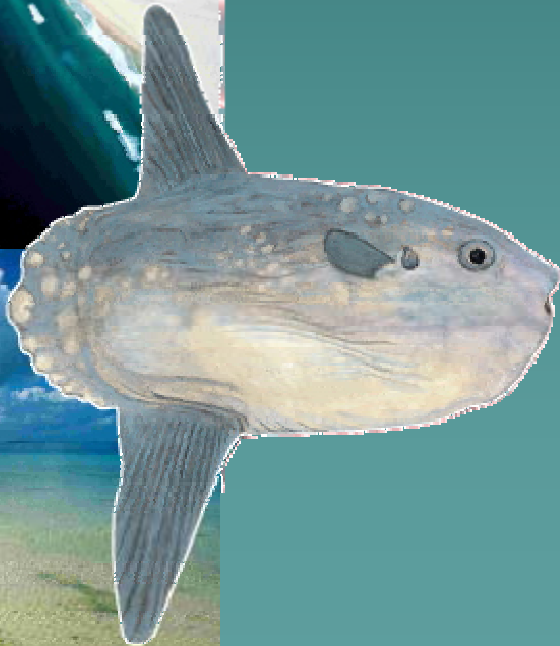


## COASTAL LIVELIHOODS STUDY



2008

- ◆ A range of coastal activities not covered in original TOR for ASCLME and SWIOF, ASCLME tasked with undertaking these.
- ◆ These include artisanal fisheries, related coastal goods and services, tourism, aquaculture, marine refugia

2008

- ◆ An initial series of discussions were held with SWIOF (the Oceanographic Research Institute) and a very rough Project TOR was developed.

2008

- ◆ A revised draft (as per MEDA requirements) was developed in conjunction with ReCoMaP, grouped under the heading of Coastal Livelihoods

2008

- ◆ This discussion document was presented, discussed, and amended accordingly, at the Regional Meeting of ASCLME Technical Coordination Groups (COGs), and the Regional Forum of Western Indian Ocean Projects.

- ◆ A TOR developed for the appointment of a Regional Coordinator for the project and this is in the process of being filled.

2009:

- ◆ TORs for a regional Artisanal Fisheries Specialist and a Tourism Specialist are available and the positions in the process of being filled.

2009:

- ◆ The Project TOR will then be further refined in collaboration with regional partners, and further national/regional experts appointed.

2009:

- ◆ Data collection is largely desk top but there is some limited funding available for collection of field data and further analysis, e.g. assessment of data poor fisheries
